

My student is struggling!

What do I do?

Step 1: Check RDS

The first thing to do is to check RDS. See which classes they are struggling in. Click on the class to see if they are missing assignments. Knowing what they are struggling with will help.

Step 2: Turn In and Retest

At Harrison, teachers accept all late work. If something is missing, have your student turn it in. Also, students can retake almost any test if they didn't do well the first time. If you see a bad test grade, have them redo it.

Step 3: Talk to the Teacher

The teachers are the best source of information about what is happening in a class. Teachers can usually respond more quickly to emails, but a call will work too. If you have questions about what your student needs to do, please ask the teacher.

Step 4: Talk to the Counselor

Sometimes, a student is struggling in multiple classes. In these cases, it's best to speak with a counselor. They can provide support and guidance to help students develop habits that will help them in all classes.

Step 5: Stay After School
